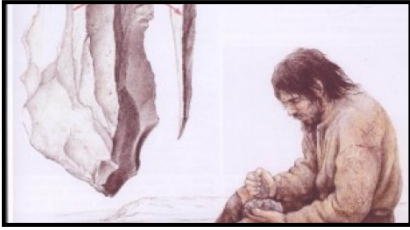


Hinckley Archaeological Society



Guided Walk through a local historic landscape on Saturday 28th July 2018

Come and join us on a short walk from Frolesworth to Sharnford in Leicestershire (**approx 3km**) through a long period of pre-history.

See areas where Stone Age man knapped flints for hunting animals and making flint scrapers and blades to prepare their food.

Also, see evidence of continuous occupation from pre-history through Roman and Anglo-Saxon times to modern day.

Park at Manor Farm, Main Street, Frolesworth LE17 5EE and meet your guides there at **10.30am**.

The cost of the Guided Walk is **£3** per person and suitable for children over the age of 12 accompanied by an adult.
